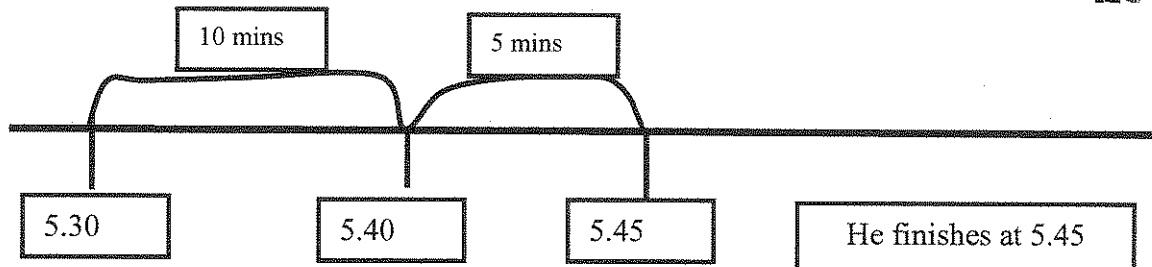

Time Word Problems

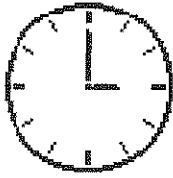
Use a number line to help you solve these problems for example:-

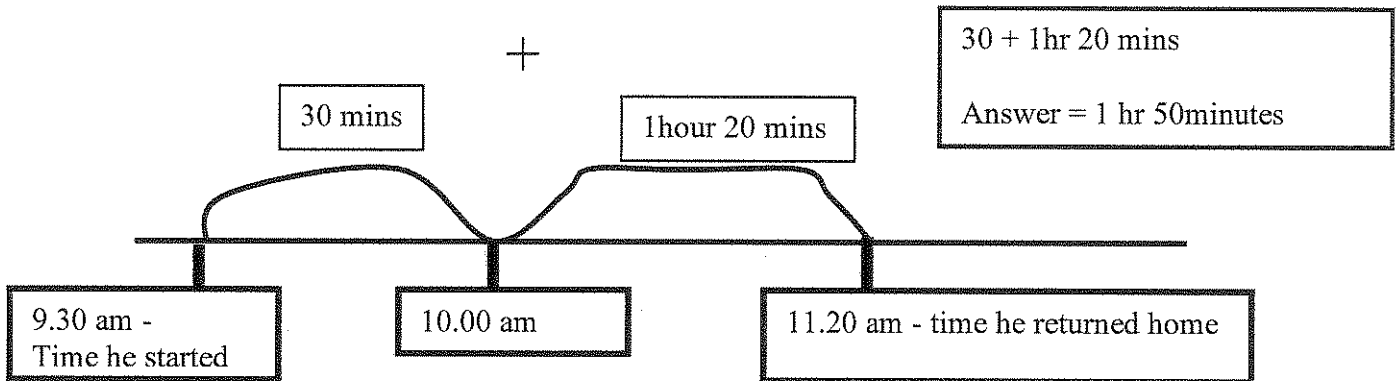
1. It is three o'clock. What time will it be in 3 hours time?
