Use the menu to calculate what the family might have had to eat and drink.

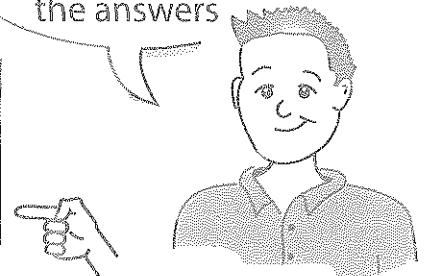

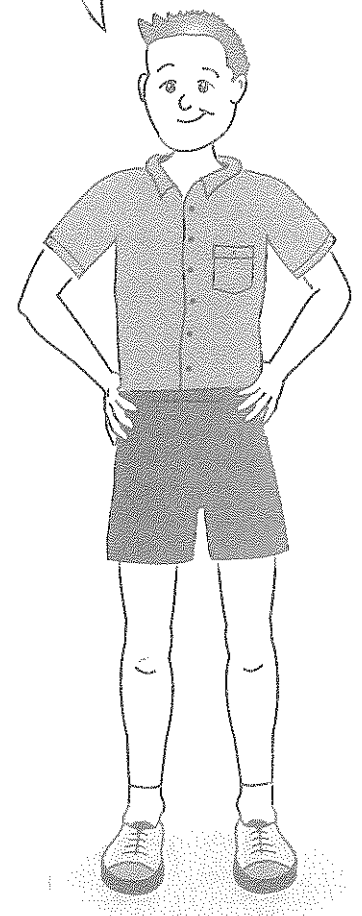

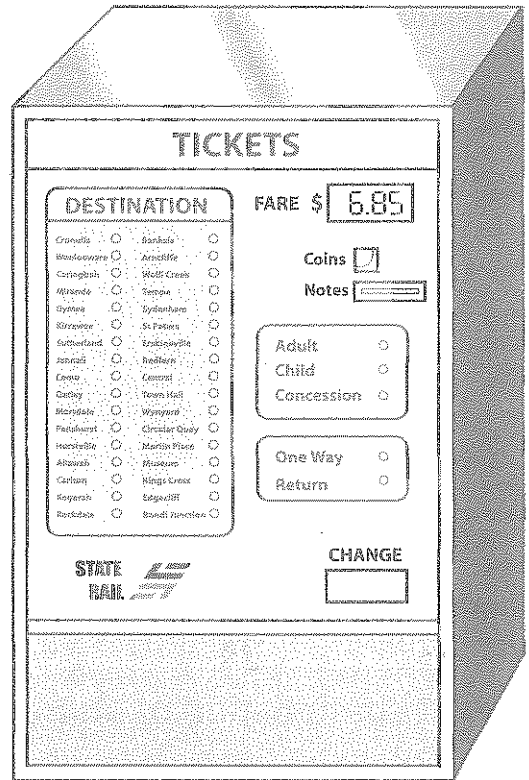
# At the railway station

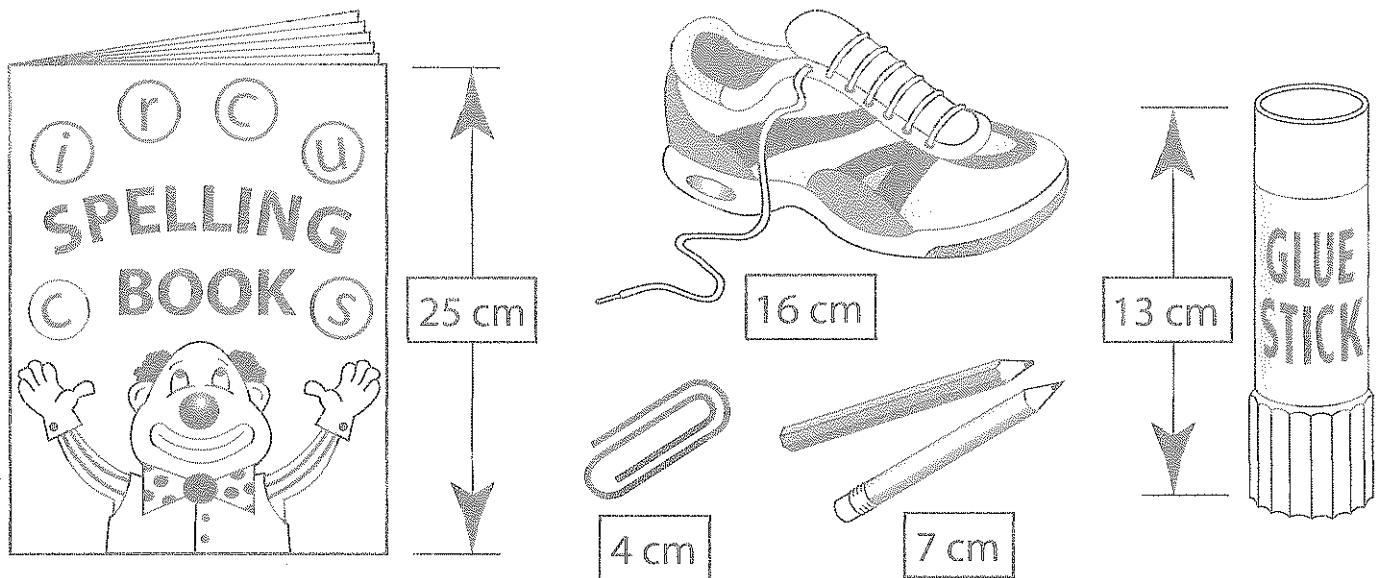
