

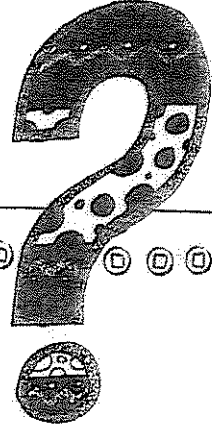
Asking Sentences
